An important part of her experience is that of her parents, their family and over 120,000 Japanese Americans incarcerated in internment camps during WWII. “Actions based on “irrational fear” of foreigners, in a time of war and the need for “national security”, coupled with economic hardship can change peoples’ lives forever.” says Kubo whose work is philosophical, historical and brim full of personal narratives as she “sorts out how she feels about humanity, and the world around her.”
